Strategic planning is a high-leverage organizational strategy used by all forms of organizations to identify their goals, the strategies necessary to accomplish those goals, and the internal performance management system used to monitor and evaluate progress.

In the summer of 2022, The Executive Team worked in concert with outside consultants to pick up writing a Strategic Plan where the previous five-year plan left off. Over months and guidance of other staff members, the Parent Council, and some teaching staff, a new plan was drafted that will take the school from 2022 to 2027. The Strategic Plan consists of four priorities and goals to help achieve these priorities.

PRIORITY 1: LEARNING AND EDUCATION

Students are challenged to think, question, and solve.

Goals:

- Design student-centered learning programs and experiences
- Implement innovative teaching and learning
- Integrate faith and learning in systematic ways throughout the school
- Create a robust virtual, distinctively Christian learning platform
- Elevate the pre-kindergarten program

PRIORITY 2: COMMUNITY AND CULTURE

Encourage involvement in activities and events that build community through graciously serving and loving one another.

Goals:

- Improve communication regarding MCA events, parent groups, and volunteerism
- Enhance the student community through relationshipbuilding activities and programs
- Improve staff culture by providing staff activities, a healthier work environment, and team collegiality
- Establish an accessible network of community members to strengthen relationships and share expertise

PRIORITY 3: RESOURCE CAPACITY

The school has developed a detailed dashboard and team system to help keep the school on track as it progresses through the plan over the next five years.

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In a joint venture with our parent ministry, Living Word, the 2021–2022 school year brought many changes, including a remodel of our second floor to create seven new classrooms to support our increasing enrollment. These endeavors, along with our Gala and all-school fundraiser, allowed us to end the year with a positive financial report. The additional revenue enabled us to begin an investment with a foundation to build cash reserves, increase program offerings, and hire experienced staff to benefit our school, families, and students to live out our mission.

As a reminder, MCA's financials are part of Living Word Christian Center's (LW) annual audit. A copy of Living Word's Annual Report will be available in the alcoves of LW beginning in March of 2023.

Thank you for your prayers and partnership with us. It takes all of us to deliver an exceptional learning environment for your students.

A PERSPECTIVE FROM THE ADMISSIONS TEAM.

In a time when the pandemic was working to shut down every corner of our lives, including church and school, God was at work driving parents to seek out a better alternative to public education, many of whom turned to Christian schools. In fact, the admissions department received 900 applications in the last three years—we've walked dozens of miles around the campus giving tours!

As a result of the demand, Maranatha doubled down on its commitment to keep Christ at the center and stand firm on the biblical integration of our academic program. We remained diligent to ensure that families seeking an MCA education shared the same biblical values. This resulted in only 75% of the applications receiving an offer of admission from MCA.

We prioritized in-person learning AND excellent Christ-centered academics during a time when many schools struggled to remain open. We've expanded our campus with new classrooms, course offerings, and an online school. Our academic results are proof of our commitment to excellence, and your children are the benefactors of that priority.

This catapulted Maranatha into the top rankings for private Christian schools in the area. In fact, Niche, a school review site, has ranked Maranatha in the top 10 for Best Christian High School in Minnesota, Most Diverse Private High School in Minnesota, and Best Private K–12 School in Minnesota.

Now, nearly 900 students call MCA home, with 89% of families continuing to choose Maranatha each year. We value that partnership and are honored to come alongside our parents. We know there will always be a reason why families seek out an alternative to public education, and we are thrilled to be able to proudly showcase all that MCA has to offer. But most importantly, we are incredibly proud and unashamed to show our commitment to Christ and the truth of God's Word, which remains foundational to the excellence found within the classrooms of our campus.





Creating a Space to Accelerate Learning

MCA Accelerated provides extension activities and accelerated curricula for advanced and/or academically gifted students and supports advanced students' social and emotional needs. Students are identified for the program through testing and teacher recommendation. Students complete extension activities in the areas of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) and/or Language Arts, participate in project-based learning activities, real-life investigations into STEM careers, events and competitions, and ACT/ SAT test preparation.

College Prep? You Bet!

College Degree and High School Diploma – Yes, please. At MCA, students begin preparing for the plan God has for them as soon as they step foot on campus. If the student's goal is to attend university, our professional staff will guide each student's journey. One path is to be a part of the Associate of Arts Degree program. In collaboration with Bethel University, 29 seniors received their Maranatha diploma and a degree from Bethel.

Show 'em the Money!

The 70 seniors that made up the Class of 2022 were offered over \$7,780,000 in scholarships. Impressive.

Supporting Learning at All Levels

Learning Support Services is one of the fastest growing areas at the Academy. Here students are identified as those who need extra support. By doing so, students in the program receive specific attention to guide them toward academic success, while the rest of the students in class are able to be challenged academically, thus, creating a win-win scenario.

Going into the Meals for Minneapolis event, Maranatha students, staff, and volunteers had already packed over 200,000 meals for local food shelves. In addition, families raised over \$578,000 over the previous eight years. In 2021, MCA decided to reset the bar, setting a new goal of packing 50,000 meals and raising \$100,000. With the help of a great team and superb volunteers, the school reached its meal-packing goal and exceeded its fundraising goal raising over \$115,000.

MCA Gala 2022

The theme for the MCA Gala 2021 was Kingdom Building Together. God blesses a strong community with clarity when the connection is healthy and purposeful. The 2021 Gala brought us together to support our mission and advance the kingdom of God. This year's Gala was very successful, raising nearly \$160,000 because of our generous MCA families and friends, students, teachers, and staff.

Over 7,000 teams competed in FIRST Tech Challenge, the league in which our high school robotics teams participated. From that number, only 160 teams qualified for the World Championships. By winning the State Championship, Chain Reaction, Maranatha's Senior team, was one of the 160 to make the journey to Houston, Texas. And the team finished in the top 24! Additionally, Chain Reaction was also one of six finalists for the "Connect Award," highlighting the team's work to connect with STEM professionals in their community during the entire season. What an accomplishment!
