STRATEGIC PLAN 2022-27

In the summer of 2022, The Executive Team worked in concert with outside consultants to pick up writing a Strategic Plan where the previous five-year plan left off. Over months of guidance from other staff members, the Parent Council, and various teaching staff, a new plan was drafted that will take the school from 2022 to 2027. The Strategic Plan consists of four priorities and goals to help achieve these priorities.

PRIORITY 1: LEARNING AND EDUCATION

Students are challenged to think, question, and solve.

Goals:

- Design student-centered learning programs and experiences
- Implement innovative teaching and learning
- Integrate faith and learning in systematic ways throughout the school
- Create a robust virtual, distinctively Christian learning platform
- Elevate the pre-kindergarten program

PRIORITY 2: COMMUNITY AND CULTURE

Encourage involvement in activities and events that build community through graciously serving and loving one another.

Goals:

- Improve communication regarding MCA events, parent groups, and volunteerism
- Enhance the student community through relationship-building activities and programs
- Improve staff culture by providing staff activities, a healthier work environment, and team collegiality
- Establish an accessible network of community members to strengthen relationships and share expertise

Strategic planning is a high-leverage organizational strategy used by all forms of organizations to identify their goals, the strategies necessary to accomplish those goals, and the internal performance management system used to monitor and evaluate progress. The school has developed a detailed dashboard and team system to help keep the school on track as it progresses through the plan over the next five years.



Taking Learning Online

Maranatha continues to enhance its online school, Maranatha Christian Online. With more courses being curated by MCA teachers, the future is looking bright.

Hired Administrators

Maranatha hired dedicated High School, Middle School, and Lower School Assistant Principals and Counselors.

Record Enrollment

Maranatha experienced its highest enrollment ever for the 2022-2023 school year. Also, X-Tended Day enrollment was up over 50%.

Security

Security is a high priority for Maranatha. Over the year, we replaced and/or upgraded over 30 surveillance cameras in the building. Additionally, in conjunction with Living Word, a secure check-in kiosk was created in the Main Lobby entrance.

We are proud of the accomplishments in all areas of the school.

- The Lower School received a \$20,000 grant to improve Pre-kindergarten programming
- Expanded lower school technology by adding a 3-D printer.
- Grade 5 was moved to Middle School
- Grade 5 implemented a trip to Biz Town, further enhancing business/entrepreneurship education.
- Migrated Spanish down to the middle school
- Introduced Cell Phone Permit Classes
- High School introduced Discipleship Groups
- The High School continues to prepare students for college and beyond with the Associate of Arts Program through Bethel University, Mustang Enterprises, and even more robust robotics programs. Colleges and universities around the country, offered, Maranatha's 75 seniors \$10,737,907 in scholarships.



Alumni Program

MCA's first graduating class was in 1978. Since then, there have been many Mustangs who have gone out to make a difference in the world. This year, MCA started an Alumni Program to begin re-engaging with the over 1000 graduates. In the first year:

- Over 450 alumni responded to be included in future communications.
- Social media sites, Facebook and Instagram, were established and followers grew to over 160
- An Electronic Newsletter averaged 45% open rate with a 25% click rate.
- Key engagement events were part of the launch and included a successful Alumni Basketball game and the largest Mustang Meetup Alumni Event at Homecoming.

Strong Fiscal Management

Maranatha built up its cash reserves and increased compensation for faculty by 6% and staff by 8% to align better with the marketplace.



Building Improvements

Maranatha's enrollment growth demanded a plan for expansion and improvements to the facilities. This past year, MCA added 15 new classrooms/learning spaces, including eight new upper school classrooms and a multi-use learning lane, seven new lower school classrooms, an enhanced College and Career Center, a new Pre-K Center room, a new weight room, and an upgraded playground with new Gaga Ball Pit mats.



Dear MCA Families,

Over the 2022–2023 school year, MCA reached several milestones and broke some records along the way. During our tenth all-school outreach and fundraiser, **Meals for Minneapolis**, we packed and delivered nearly 60,000 meals to local food shelves through Second Harvest Heartland and raised over \$98,000.

The MCA Gala, Anchored in Him, was held at Leopold's Mississippi Gardens. Over 200 attendees took the dessert auction to another level of competition, raising over \$33,000. There was something for everyone in this year's silent and live auctions featuring our Lower School classroom baskets, beautiful vacation home getaways, and much more. In total, the gala raised over \$183,000.

Every year, the **Maranatha Fund** is our top fundraising priority. Annually, parents, grandparents, and friends of the academy choose to financially support the Maranatha Fund by donating over and above tuition dollars. This year, you invested over \$143,000. These gifts benefit our students, faculty, and staff through innovation and program investment, tuition assistance and financial aid, teacher and staff development, and our MCA endowment. Thank you for your continued support!



Making History

The **Boys' Soccer Team** made history by making it to the Section Final and winning the game, which propelled them to the State Tournament for the first time. The boys didn't stop there and won the first State Tournament game in Mustangs Soccer History. In the end, the team ended up with a third-place trophy!

The **Girls' Soccer Team** also had a great year, making it to the Section Finals, marking the first time that both boys and girls made it to the Section Finals.



Swimming to Sections

Last Season, Brady Landstad and Mason Krings competed on the Osseo Boys' Swim Team in the Section Finals. Brady swam individually in the 100 Freestyle and 100 Backstroke, finishing 12th in both disciplines. Mason swam the 100 Fly individually, finishing sixth in the section with a time of 52.96, breaking a long-standing Osseo Boys Swim and Dive record. He also competed in the 100 Breaststroke, finishing in seventh place. Mason and Brady finished fifth in the 200 Freestyle relay, and the boys took third place in the 400 relay.

Both High School FTC Robotics teams qualified for state...again! Teams Proto Plasma and Dark Matter qualified out of 48 teams in the state. Dark Matter finished second in the alliance round, bringing home the hardware, while Team Proto Plasma earned the Motivate award.
