NHS: NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Description: The National Honor Society (NHS) is the nation's premier organization established to recognize outstanding high school students. NHS serves to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of Scholarship, Leadership, Service, and Character. These characteristics have been associated with membership in the organization since 1921.

Requirements: Students in grades 10-12 wanting to participate in NHS must have a 3.5+ GPA, complete an application, and demonstrate excellence in Scholarship, Leadership, Service, and Character. Students in the society must participate in two NHS community service activities with a minimum of four hours of service time.

Schedule: candidates will be informed of their status in October and inducted on the second Monday in November. The society will meet every month to conduct meetings and schedule service projects.

Fees: \$35.00. (Members will also have the option to purchase an NHS shirt designed by chapter leadership)

NJHS: NATIONAL JUNIOR HONOR SOCIETY

Advisor: Mr. Ward Bennett

Description: The National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) is the nation's premier organization established to recognize outstanding middle school students. The NJHS serves to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of Scholarship, Service, Leadership, and Character. These characteristics have been associated with membership in the organization since 1929.

Requirements: Students in grades 6-9 who participate in the NJHS must have a 3.5+ GPA, complete an application, and demonstrate excellence in Scholarship, Service, Leadership, and Character. Students in the society must also participate in two NJHS community service activities with a minimum of four hours of service time.

Schedule: Candidates will be informed of their status in December and inducted in January. The society will meet every month to conduct meetings and schedule service projects.

Fees: \$30.00 (Members will also have the option to purchase an NJHS shirt/sweater designed by chapter leadership)







HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT COUNCIL

Advisor: Ms. Jamie Axelberg

Description: High School Student Council is an elected body of students in grades 9-12 who seek to support the vision of MCA by positively impacting campus life and student culture. They accomplish this through effective servant leadership, constructive input on school policies, and planning and executing of school social events and service outreaches.

Requirements: Students must complete an application within the published deadline. All candidates will be subject to the recommendations of upper school staff.

Schedule: The Student Council election takes place in the spring for the election of members who will serve in the following school year. A specific schedule for the application process and elections will be published in the spring.

Fees: \$60 (\$135 with retreat)



MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENT COUNCIL

Advisor: Mrs. Mackenzie Franck

Description: Middle School Student Council will consist of seventh and eighthgrade council members. The group will meet once/week during advisory. Meetings consist of prayer, leadership training, working the school store, and event planning. Council member duties include serving in an office, setting up and selling for fundraisers, working at least two hours per week at the school store, organizing and participating in events, and being a leader and example for other students.

Requirements: Students must fill out a self-evaluation form and have it signed by their parents. They must have a GPA of 3.2 or above and no quarter grade failing. Middle School teachers will submit recommendations and students will vote on their grade's candidates. Important qualities for a student council member include a willingness to serve others, responsibility, organization, dependability, honesty, reliability, and a Christ-like attitude.

Schedule: A specific schedule for the application process will be published in the spring.

FIRST TECH CHALLENGE

Description: It's way more than building robots. FIRST Tech Challenge teams are challenged to design, build, program, and operate robots to compete in a head-to-head challenge in an alliance format. Guided by adult coaches and mentors, students develop STEM skills and practice engineering principles, while realizing the value of hard work, innovation, and teamwork. The robot control system is programmed using a variety of levels of Java. Teams design and build robots, design and market their team brand, and do community outreach to earn specific awards. Participants are eligible to apply for \$80M+ in college scholarships.

Practice Starts: Tuesdays/Thursdays (6:00 pm – 8:30 pm) + Saturdays (9:00 am – 12:00 pm)

Season Duration: September – January, (February as well if teams qualify for State)

Location: Upper School STEM Lab

Student Maximum: 12

Cost: \$500



FIRST LEGO LEAGUE

Description: Friendly competition is at the heart of the Challenge, as teams of students engage in research, problem-solving, coding, and engineering – building and programming a LEGO robot that navigates the missions of a robot game. As part of the Challenge, teams also participate in a research project to identify and solve a relevant real-world problem.

Advisor: Mr. Wayne Matthews



Advisor: Mr. Eric Sherman


