WHY ATTEND THE SENIOR RETREAT? All senior class members are expected to attend the retreat*. Our desire is to take the time at the beginning of the school year to bond as a class and to dedicate the year to the Lord. Basically, these are the best two days to kick off your senior year with your class—you really don't want to miss it!

We will also be planning and working on many senior-related events while at the retreat, as well as bonding as a class. All students will ride the bus that leaves campus at 1:00 pm on Thursday, September 11th. All students will return to campus by 3:00 pm on Friday, September 12th. (No leaving early or coming late except in extenuating circumstances.) All food, snacks, and drinks are provided.
